A total of 186 patients, that included 18 HIV/AIDS and 38 TB patients, benefitted from a holistic care plan to manage terminal symptoms and provide support for the individual and their family, within the comfort of familiar surroundings.	
	Billed patient fees accounted for ± 20.53% (2015- ±7.42%) of gross income earned by Centurion	The total number of interventions for patients and household members were 12 827 and 1 170 respectively.	
	Hospice for the year under review.	The total cost of providing Hospice care is not always covered by medical schemes. Any medical scheme short fall, as well as the cost of treating public health care patients, is funded by Centurion Hospice Association. For the year under review, the ratio of paying vs sponsored patients was 4:1.

	Patients receive general inpatient care at Centurion Hospice IPU facility for pain control, acute or multifaceted symptom management.	Centurion Hospice IPU admitted 55 terminally il patients for inpatient care; for these patients Centurion Hospice: • made a difference during their last few days enabling the patient to live with both pair and symptoms under control, and • helped individual patients maintain dignity and some control over the manner in which they died	
III.	Psychosocial Unit Hospice care encompasses bereavement care and counseling to surviving family and friends; during the year under review these service offerings were expanded.	Centurion Hospice embraces the fundamenta principle of hospice holistic care. The whole person including body, mind and spirit is treated. Much needed support for the emotional, spiritual and social needs of both patients and families were provided in diverse communities, and offered in diverse settings.

	Resource recycling remains the primary economic engine driving value creation for beneficiaries of Hospice care provided by Centurion Hospice.	Net revenue derived from the sale of second-hand goods is applied towards the covering of overhead costs in providing Hospice care and capita improvements to the Hospice facilities.	



Much effort was, and continues to be expended in sourcing in-kind donations of used goods predominantly from the community for resale in our Charity Shop that contributed ± 58.35% (2015 - ±48%) of our gross revenue for the year under review. Further contributory gross revenue to cover funding shortfall was derived from:

Local and National Government / Foreign Agency grants & subsidies ± 4.29% (2015-±22%)

Cash donations sourced from corporates and individuals ± 13.65% (2015 - ±13%)

Other ± 3.18% (2015 - ± 9.79%)

The ultimate goal being growth in service, resourceraising, finance and administration.

Irrespective of their socio-economic standing, all patients in the demarcated area serviced by Centurion Hospice received quality Hospice Care in the comfort of their chosen environment.
